For beginners — no previous Spanish required. Classes start from zero and build up through A1 and A2.

- Communicate effectively in everyday situations they are likely to encounter while living and traveling in Latin America.
- Build and understand increasingly complex messages in Spanish, using the grammar and vocabulary appropriate to their level.
- Interact with greater confidence and autonomy in practical situations such as accommodation, transportation, shopping, payments, healthcare, and local services.
- Participate in everyday social interactions, moving beyond survival Spanish to initiate, maintain, and respond in real conversations.
- Develop strategies for understanding native speakers and communicating successfully even when they do not understand every word.
- Recognize common linguistic and cultural variation across Latin America and adapt to different contexts while traveling.
- Use immersion as part of the learning process, applying what they learn in class to real situations and bringing those experiences back into their Spanish practice.

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Greet people, introduce yourself, say where you're from and what you do, spell things out loud, and exchange contact details.

REAL SITUATIONS

Meeting people at your accommodation or coworking space, a check-in, introducing yourself to a host or roommate, explaining that you work remotely.

02 Daily Life & Basic Needs

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Talk about routines, order food, shop for what you need, ask prices and quantities, and talk about weather and what to wear.

Markets and supermarkets, restaurants and set menus, cooking at your place, buying sunscreen or an adapter, checking what's in your food.

03 Getting Around & Planning

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Ask for and give directions, check schedules and prices, buy tickets, book a stay, and talk about your next destination.

REAL SITUATIONS

Bus terminals and airports, asking about connections, comparing routes, booking a bed or an excursion, changing a reservation.

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Describe a home, ask about rental conditions, request services, report a problem, and compare options.

REAL SITUATIONS

Renting a room or apartment, talking to a host or landlord, getting a SIM card or internet plan, joining a gym, reporting that the wifi is down.

Four modules to handle money, health, paperwork, and the relationships that make a place feel like home.

05 Money, Payments & Spending

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Withdraw and exchange money, understand payment methods, split expenses, compare prices, and make a complaint.

REAL SITUATIONS

ATMs, Western Union, currency exchange, paying by card or QR, splitting costs with roommates, disputing an incorrect charge.

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Describe symptoms, say where it hurts, ask for medication, book an appointment, and ask for help in an emergency.

Pharmacies, bites and allergies, a medical appointment, using travel insurance, explaining an accident, reading a prescription.

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Immigration and customs, visa conditions, requesting a stay extension, signing a simple contract, resolving a documentation issue.

YOU'LL BE ABLE TO

Language exchanges, meeting people through coworking or shared living, recommending a destination, communicating boundaries, joining local activities.
